

GOBLIN SECRETS

William Alexander Atheneum March 2012 Ages 8+

The day began like any other in Southside, with sweepers whisking away street dust, dustfish swimming around sweepers, and Rownie waking up when Graba summons him to run an errand.

Graba is a grandmother to many Southside children, but "grandmother" does not mean "mother's mother" or "father's mother" to any of them. Neither mothers nor fathers are a part of this household, and here the word *grandmother* simply means *Graba*, a powerful witch who walks on long and artificial bird-legs. The word "goblin" here means *Tamlin* rather than *monster*, and the word "brother" means someone who disappeared, suddenly, while hidden behind a mask.

For Rownie the day ends very differently, with a theatrical performance outlawed by the Lord Mayor of All Zombay. After Rownie sets foot on a Tamlin stage, he is forced to face fearful curses, haunted masks, gearwork soldiers, and an outraged Graba. Rownie will do what he must, and wear masks of his own, to find a lost brother, a voice that speaks to rivers and holds back floods, and a place to belong.



Flora would love to leave her pigpen.



THE COLDEST GIRL IN COLDTOWN

You know how it is in this business: something hits big and all of a sudden, everyone's copying it, often with cheap knockoff novels that are ultimately forgettable, and we all start complaining about it and wondering if anyone will ever publish anything original ever again. And then along comes a novel that completely reinvigorates the genre, twists the trope back on itself, and reminds us why we once did love it. I remember how much I'd hated on Holocaust novels, determined never to read another one...and then there was The Book Thief, and I had to eat my words.

Well, I'm pretty damn happy to say I get to do so again. Because the award-winning, bestselling author of *Tithe*, *Valiant*, *Ironside* and the recent Curse Workers trilogy (*White Cat*, *Red Glove*, *Black Heart*), and of course The Spiderwick Chronicles, has returned to a longtime love of hers, the vampire novel, and it's not like anything you've ever read before. Inspired by her own award-nominated short story, THE COLDEST GIRL IN COLDTOWN, is a story of rage and revenge, of guilt and horror...and yes, of love, told in only the way Holly can.

When 17-year-old Tana Bach wakes up in a bathtub after a particularly wild party, a hangover turns out to be the least of her concerns. She quickly discovers that everyone else at the party has been killed, and soon after finds her ex-boyfriend handcuffed to a bed, and a vampire chained nearby. And that's only the beginning of the nightmare: there are more vampires in the house, and they're done toying around.

Tana flees with Gavriel (the vampire) and her ex (Aidan), only to learn that Aidan has in fact been bitten already himself, and if he drinks blood, will turn. Determined to save him, as she was unable to do for her mother, she heads to the nearest Coldtown, the quarantined cities where vampires are allowed to stay...and around which a weird celebrity has built, attracting hordes of human fans and worshippers.

Tana soon finds that curing Aidan isn't on his agenda, and that Gavriel has some dark secrets of his own. Caught up in a whirlwind of vampire politics, Tana must try and save herself and Gavriel, but the price she'll be forced to pay will be high.

But they are in middle school now. Zach's father pushes him to stop pretending, and finally Zach quits the game. Their friendship might be over, until Poppy declares she's been dreaming about the Queen—and the ghost of a girl who will not rest until the bone-china doll is buried in her empty grave.

Zach and Alice and Poppy set off on one last adventure to lay the Queen's ghost to rest. But nothing goes according to plan, and as their adventure turns into an epic journey, creepy things begin to happen. Is the doll just a doll or something more sinister? And if there really is a ghost, will it let them go now that it has them in its clutches?

Heartbreaking and haunting, Black has crafted an epic tale of growing up that readers will not soon forget.


Can Kat save her sister's life, the Order of the Guardians, and England itself before it's too late?
